MITCHELL AND THE OREGONIAN

Oregonian: "The truth about the legislative 'holdup' is seen with perfect clearness, and there is no difficulty in allotting the responsibility. On one side it is 'Mitchell or nobody.' This was met on the other by 'Anybody but Mitchell.' Such was the situation, and it accounts for the fact that there was no legislative session."

The Oregonian led the van of the faction that cried "Anybody but Mitchell." Between the factions the legislature was held up, and in consequence bad laws are unreported, needed laws have not been enacted, and hundreds of thousands of dollars have been taken from the people and out of circulation to be locked up by the state treasurer, else loaned through favorite agencies.

The same fight is again on between the Mitchell and Oregonian factions. What will conscientious voters do when they deposit their ballots next June? Will they vote Mitchell, or Oregonian, or for the people? They should not vote for any candidate for the legislature who will not pledge himself to attend to the business of the state, Mitchell or no Mitchell, Oregonian or no Oregonian.

We desire to deal fairly with our political opponents. We blame them only for allowing these self constituted bosses to dominate party councils at the expense of the taxpayers of the state. It matters little who is elected senator, but it is of great importance that the legislature should meet and attend to its legitimate business.

The GUARD sees but one way by which the people can free themselves from these conscienceless political dictators. Elect men, populists, democrats or republicans who have no strings on them and will work for the interests of the state regardless of faction and party. The shameful farce witnessed at the attempted meeting of the legislature in January 1897 should not again be rendered possible. If the republican party will not bury its political bosses a union of opposing forces can accomplish a decent interment. And those forces should not fail in their plain duty.
