The order of the cabinet to engage Alice Deadmond witness State vs ocean transportation with which to send the Pacific coast volunteers to the Philippines brings the war right home to our own door, for it means that about sixty Eugene young men will have to go to that far away country. The islands are just below the 20th parallel of latitude, slightly further south than Cuba, which is just above the 20th parallel and hence is in a very warm climate. There are only about 5,000 white peop e on the island, and most of them are Spenish soldiers, who are there to hold the country. The natives are of Malay type.
