CREDITORS WANT GOLD STAND. AID.

The Salem Statesman is in with the Britishers in that it approvingly quotes a statement that Great Britain is solid for the gold standard.

Why? The world's debt is practically held by British capitalists who know that in the appreciation of gold by reason of the gold standard their securities will be greatly enhanced in value.

Cut off one-half the metallic money as a legal tender and the remaining one-half cannot but become of far greater value. It is the simple law of supply and demand that controls money values almost as surely as that of wheat or any other product.

Make it scarce you make it more valuable. It is not to be wondered at that when you find a creditor, to any large extent, you find a gold standard advocate. He does not want "cheap" money. Money is his stock in trade and he desires to render it more valuable.

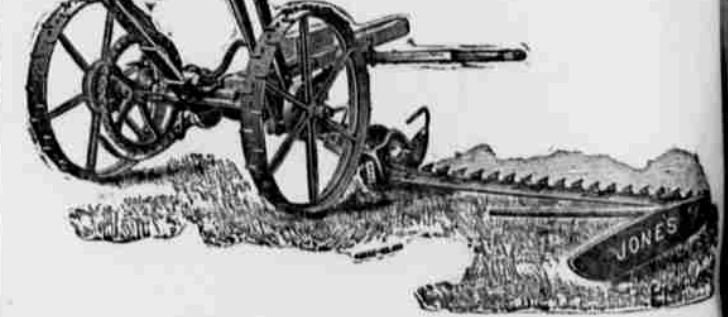
