

Mount's Hall was secured at \$11 per month including fuel and janitor service. The enrollment in the ninth and tenth grades is 95 with an average attendance of 82. This number will be increased by about 40 at the beginning of the second term on next Monday, Thus by the addition of only two teachers we have provided instruction for over 125 more pupils than before these extra grades were added.

Several of the rooms should be replastered, the building should be repainted outside and inside, and the foundation repaired.
