Five dollars a day for each of these clerks would have accomplished just as much for the state as did \$10 per day. To pay \$9.50 or \$10 is all the more culpable, because wholly unnecessary.

The rate is more than three times the pay of members, and in most markets brains come higher than clerical capacity. If members are willing to brave all the hazards and responsibilities of a legislative career for \$3 per day clerks should be considered well paid at \$5 per day for transacting the dangerless routine of a clerkship. 
