MONEY FOR CUBAN TROOPS

Paymanter-General Carey Will Go to Cuba Next Week and Distribute \$3,000,000.

American Officers to Disburse

New York, March 6 -A dispatch to the Herald from Washington says: Paymaster-General Carey has perfected arrangements for going to Cuba next week to pay off the Cuban army.

General Carsy will take the entire appropriation of \$3,000,000 to Cubs, \$1,500,000 of which will be in silver and the remainder in gold or bills. He will leave New York on the government transports, to which the money will be transferred from the sub-treasury, and upon his arrival at Hayana he will report to General Brooks.
