titles of human fortune. The tolerance with which these returning pilgrims from Johannesburg speak of President Kruger as their London friend. He is credited by them with a clear perception of the inevitable outcome of the war whatever was the earliest results of the conflict. President Steyn is described by them as the evil genius of South Africa, as a shrewd, intelligent ambitious man.

"The rear guard came away from Johannesburg with the conviction that President Kruger had been dragged into the war against his will and judgment, and that Steyn had involved the Orange Free State in a fatal struggle, in which it had everything to lose and nothing to gain, and that he had no other incentive than a dream of a powerful Dutch republic.

"Evacuation had been in progress for weeks before the final signal for war, and then the English rear guard of confidential advisers and trusted employees of every great mining corporation were ordered to go. The richest gold fields in the world, with the costliest mechanism for crushing, and chemical treatment of the sandstone and conglomerate and deep-level mining, were left under charge of foreign underlings and native servants. Palatial residences were turned over to the care of the takers, and their occupants locked and barred from doors and drove to the station, convinced that their furniture and art treasures would be looted before the end of the war."

The dispatches announce that President McKinley will insist on "open door" commercial rights in any part of China that may be appropriated by another country. Our high tariff president has modified his views considerably, and evidently considers foreign trade worth striving for. The tariff protected beneficiaries of this country go into the China market and sell in open competition with France, Germany and England at lower rates than are asked the people of the United States. The farmer and producer is robbed for the benefit of the manufacturer.

A strong effort is being made to fill the vacancy on the inter-state commerce commission with a western man. The stand heretofore taken by the war party is that it is necessary that something be done to save the coast trade.

Dallas Times Mountaineer: "It is stated that there was a celebration in Dufur yesterday when the news of Monday's battle in South Africa was received. Some of the enthusiastic admirers of the Boers butchered a nice pig and hoisted it to the top of a flagpole."

THE TWO EDITORS.

Metropolitan journals are supplied with a commercial and financial editor in addition to the chief who controls the editorial column. Wherein general comment is made on matters political and of current event. This assignment of work leads to no little disagreement in gold standard organs between the financial and political editors. The latter individual gets an idea into his head, and either purposely or ignorantly, the latter we believe, ignores the facts collated by his brother editor. We give an instance from the Portland Telegram of October 4. The political editor writes:

"Mr Bryan isn't saying anything these days about the parity of wheat and silver. Even Mr Towne seems to have laid aside and forgotten his charts."

The financial and commercial editor, who does not happen to be troubled with theories, but deals in cold facts, has these market quotations in the same issue of the Telegram:

"New York, Nov 4.—Silver 58 1/2c.
"Portland, Nov 4.—Wheat—

Walla Walla, 56@57c; Valley, 57@58c; bluestem, 59c per bushel."

We are aware that the Portland market is lower than the average of other seaports of the United States, yet the difference is not so material as to discredit the contention of silver men that for years the prices of silver and wheat have kept in close touch. There have been exceptions through crop failures, or abnormal harvest yields, but financial and commercial statistics show a relation between silver and wheat prices that may not be attributed to chance. The quotations for more than twenty years may not be far from correct for gold in South Africa. At least the men who determine the course of the government have led the empire into a fight to protect the interests of gold and diamond miners. A London dispatch of October 4 gives this substantial hint of the cause of the war:

"Lord Hillingdon, of the banking-house of Glyn, Mills & Company, in a recent address before the institute of bankers, said that the increased Transvaal gold output for the year ended August 31 amounted to more than £3,000,000. He said he believed the world's gold production during the present year would be nearly three as great as it was 10 years ago.

"Referring to the enormous proportion of the gold fields of the world now under British control, he congratulated the bankers upon the fact that the Venezuela boundary award had added to Great Britain's share almost the whole of the extensive gold fields of that region."

PRESIDENT KRUGER AND JOHANNESBURG.

The rear guard of the English representatives of the Transvaal are straggling into London from Cape Town, says a New York Tribune dispatch of November 6. It has this to say about Johannesburg, and Presidents Kruger and Steyn!
