### WE ESTEEM THE COMPLIMENT

The silver and reform press of the state of Oregon, with few exceptions, has been remiss in exposing palpable mis-statements of the Oregonian regarding the financial question. In consequence that paper has educated no small proportion of the general public in the belief that there is no other money than gold, and that ruin would ensue should the other half of the metallic money of the country be given equal standing with the yellow metal. The GUARD has pursued a different course. It has been our delight to call attention to Oregonian fabrications and expose what too often has the appearance of willful falsity. The hide of the rhinoceros is not so thick that it may not be pierced; the Oregonian occasionally gives sign that it is vulnerable. Witness the following from the Sunday issue:

"The Eugene Register began yesterday to issue a daily morning paper. The first number is well gotten out, and gives the local news in good form. Its telegraphic service is all that the up-valley business will warrant. The paper will furnish an antidote for the silver views of the other daily at Eugene."

The Oregonian should tell the truth, at least not become responsible for a falsehood by implication. The Oregonian editorial force cannot be unaware of the fact that the Register "telegraphic service," to which it refers, partially, at least, appears in the Evening Telegram of the day preceding the publication of the Morning Register. The Evening Telegram comes to Eugene on the 12:34 night train and the Eugene paper goes to press several hours after that time. The proprietors of the Register are not throwing money away. They do not pay telegraphic toll for matter they can clip with the scissors.

Palmer on Bryan and Presidential Issues.

Gen John M Palmer of Illinois, who was a candidate for president on the gold Democratic ticket in 1896, last week in talking about the issues and candidates, said: "The leading issues for 1900 will be anti-expansion, anti-militarism, anti-trusts. At least these will be the Democratic slogans. The nomination of Mr Bryan is in my opinion a foregone conclusion. He will be nominated, and I predict he will be elected president in spite of his radical views on silver."

Such a statement, coming from Gen Palmer, is an important political utterance in that it indicates the reuniting of the Democratic forces under the leadership of Bryan. It shows that the effort to bring all classes of the opposition together is meeting with success, another remarkable instance of this being Richard Croker's espousal of Bryan's cause.

SOME CONTRADICTIONS.

The Woodburn Independent of last week, published on Thanksgiving Day, gives a list of current events, not a few of them of a local nature, for which it says, "Let us

be thankful!" We give a few:

"That prosperity has returned.

"That the cause of temperance is gaining ground.

"That Woodburn has no more than four saloons, and that these four have little financial encouragement to continue in business."

If "prosperity has returned" in the same proportion that "temperance is gaining ground" in Woodburn the crying need of the country will be more courts of bankruptcy. The last census gave the town of Woodburn a population of 405. With four saloons to her credit each hundred of the population has a saloon, with five people unsupported. Let us all be thankful that the Woodburn man can be "thankful" under such peculiar "temperance" conditions.

### FOOTBALL ROOTERS.

College football has got to that point where it requires a large force in addition to the eleven pigskin carriers and pushers. "Rooters" are an essential element. Witness the following from the San Francisco Call's ante Thanksgiving description of the University of California team, and adjuncts, as it would play with Stanford:

"Cheering at the game will be led this year, as last, by the college Rooters' Club. Some 500 of the students, decked in blue and gold caps, are to have a section specially reserved for them. A yell leader will direct all the cheering, as well as the number of rooters' songs which have been composed for the occasion."
