Of this amount less than \$16,000,000 was furnished by the United States. This includes goods that were shipped to Hong Kong, a portion of which was consumed in other ports outside of China.







areas of low barometer, having several centres of cyclonic action, may have a diameter of 6,000 miles, or may even form a belt extending nearly, if not entirely around the globe, between the parallels of 40 and 50 degrees north latitude. On the other han i, tropical cyclones are often only 500 miles, or even less in diameter.
