FLAX, SEED.
Lane County Farmers Can Experiment With the New Industry.

Smith & Moon, the Ninth-street merchants, received today a carload of flax seed from the Portland Linned Oil Works, and will distribute the same to farmers desirous of experimenting with flax growing. The Portland company will provide the seed, waiting until the crop is harvested for their pay, and will contract to pay 9 cents per bushel for the flax. This is of sufficient importance to induce most any farmer to sow a few acres. From experiments already made in Linn and Marion counties it is evident that the best of flax can be grown in the Willamette valley.

On exhibit in at this store is a sack and some twine made from flax grown near Salem, showing that the straw is of excellent value for fibre.

OUR NEIGHBOR COUNTY.

An Economical Administration of County Affairs—Low Taxes and Improvements.

Pendleton East Oregonian.
A statement of the financial condition of Linn county just issued shows there were \$111,000 less taxes collected from the taxpayers of the county during the past four years than during the previous four years. The levy this year for county purposes is only 14 1/2 mills and the amount realized for county purposes \$97,528 40. In 1892 the assessment in the county yielded \$150,354.74. In the past year Linn county has erected a substantial courthouse furnished and appointed completely with modern conveniences, bought one hundred and twenty acres of as fine farming land as lies in the county for the indigent poor, built thereon a large two story 14-room dwelling and a cottage hospital together with many other improvements, and absolutely every improvement is paid for and not one cent of indebtedness incurred. The actual annual expenses of the county when no unusual building and improving is done are about \$35,000. The county this year will more than meet all expenditures with its receipts, thus avoiding the payment of interest. Linn has set an example for other counties to follow.
