

Reconstruction of France.

The appointment of M. Thiers as Chief Executive of the Provisional Government of France, and of M. Guizot as Ambassador to England, augurs well for the success of the plans of the Orleansists.

M. Thiers is too well known as a historian and a statesman to need particular notice. A patriot, and devoted to France, in politics he is a constitutional monarchist, and as such has long been known to sympathize with the aspirations and pretensions of the House of Orleans.

M. Guizot, the newly-named Ambassador to England, has yet to make his mark in statesmanship and history, being comparatively a young man—his age thirty-five. He can only be judged of by his surroundings and the source from which he sprang.

This result may not be pleasing to American Democrats—at least they hoped for better—but it is far preferable to anarchy, or to the personal rule of a Napoleon, and is in reality a step toward actual Republican Government.

Presidential Speculations.

We note in the New York Herald, that ex-Sheriff O'Brian has been interviewed by one of the reporters of that journal, and among other topics discussed, was that of the prospects of Governor Hoffman as the nominee of the Democratic party in 1872.

We consider all the speculations as premature at this moment, and rather prejudicial to the interest of any aspirant for high office, but ex-Sheriff O'Brian's speculations deserve record. He was understood to say that Gov. Hoffman's chance was good, and that he would be the nominee of the entire party of the country, without the slightest doubt.

An Act to Protect Litigants.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the Governor of the State of Oregon, within six months after the taking effect of this act, to designate, by order filed with the Secretary of State, one newspaper for every county in the State, in which shall be published all judicial and legal advertisements for said county.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the Secretary of State, immediately on the receipt by him of an order from the Governor designating an official paper for any county, as provided in Section 1 of this act, to forward a certified copy thereof to the Clerk of said county, and such certified copy shall be filed by said Clerk in his office for the information of all parties.

SECTION 3. All notices or advertisements required prior to or during the course of any legal or judicial proceedings, shall be made in the newspaper which has been designated, appointed and confirmed, as hereinbefore provided, as the official organ in the county in which such proceedings are had.
