An Act to Protect Litigants.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of of the State of Oregon:

Section, 1. It shall be the duty of the Governor of the State of Oregen, within six months after the taking effect of this act, to designate, 'y order filed with the Secretary of State, one newspaper for every county in the State, in which shall be published all judicial and legal advertisements here last season, and which have given entire sat tor said county : Provided, That where there is isfaction to those who have used them, being wel no newspaper published within a county the Gov. adapted to different soils. ernor may designate to do the legal and judicial advertising for that county, a newspaper putlished in some other county.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the Secretary of State, immediately on the receipt by him of an order from the Governor designating an official paper for any county, as provided in Section 1 of this Act. to forwarl a certified copy thereof to the Clerk of said county, and such certified copy shall by said Clerk be filed in his office for the inform : tion of all whom it may concern.

Sec. 3. When the proprietor or proprietors of a newspaper designated as the official paper of any county, shall fie with the County Clerk of said county, a written stipulation accepting the condition of this Act. together with a bond in the sum of five hundred dollers with good and sufficient sureties to be approved by the Judge of the Judicial District in which said county is situated, for the faithful performance of the legal and judicial advertising of said county, and when such action on the part of the proprietor of a designated new -paper and the District Judge, has been certified by the Clerk of said county, to the Secretary of State. and notice of the same has been given to the Governor by the Secreta y of State, the Governor shall, without delay, by proclamation, appoint and confirm said newspaper as the medium through which all judicial and legal advertisements for said county shall be published for the term for which he may have been elected; and thereafter all notices, summonses and advertisements of whatever nature, authorized or required to be published by any law o this State, which shall be published in any other newspaper than the on so designated, shall be illega and void : Provided, That at any time, upon proof of a failure on tre part of the proprietor of any newspaper to properly publish legal and judicial advertisements, or of their noncompliance with any of the conditions of this Act, the Governor may designate and appoint and confirm, according to tht provisions of this Act, some other paper as the official organ of the county in

which such failure or default is made, Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of the Secretary of State and all County Clerks to make and forward. within ten days from notice thereof, certificates required of them by this Act, and to receive and to file all papers, bonds, and other documents mentioned in this Act, as to be filed in their respective

Sec. 5. All notices or advertisements required prior to or during the course of any legal or judicial proceedings, shall be made in the newspaper which has been designated, appointed and confirmed, as hereinbef re provibed, as the official or gan in the county in which such proceedings are had, Provided, That the prices charged for such advertising shall not exceed for each square of twelve lines of nonp reil type two dobars and fifty cents for the first, and one dollar for each subsequent insertion.

Sec. 6. Each newspaper designated under this Act shall furnish, tree of charge, one copy of its issues to the Secretary of State Librarian and Clerk of the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon, to all who may favor them with their patronage. and two copies each to the Cierks of all Courts of Record in the counties for which it is the official organ. And it shall be the duty of the Clerks of the Courts of Record aforeseid to bave one copy of said newspaper filed and from time to time bound : and the Courts may determine any question that may arise as to the publication of any legal or judicial advertisements by reference to such files with this Act are hereby repealed.




