BEARDED CHILE WHEAT.—We copy as follows from the Sutter Banner of June 10th: "We have heard it remarked by some of our farmers that the samples of wheat given to editors to notice do not represent the average, but the extreme—being extra bunches selected with care. Tuesday morning we were shown some fine samples of Bearded Chile wheat by William Bush, taken from the farm of George Myers on the plains in this county. The best sample was from a field of seven acres, the straw measuring from forty-two to forty-six inches in length, including heads, some of which measured six inches. The grain was sown early in December on Summer-fallow land. The yield will be immense. This grain will not shell out in the hot dry wind like many other varieties. We learn that N. Y. Ream has five ten-acre plots of this wheat which was sown at the same time and on Summer fallow, said to be equally as good. We have since seen Mr. Myers who says this sample is an average of his Bearded Chile, which is now ready for cutting.

ANOTHER LEE DEAD.—Charles Carter Lee, eldest son of "Light Horse" Harry Lee, of Revolutionary fame, and the last surviving brother of the late ex-Confederate Gen. R. E. Lee, died at his residence in Powhatan county, Virginia, on the 21st of April. The three Lee brothers have passed away within a short period of time. Captain Smith Lee, formerly of the United States Navy, died in August, 1869; General R. E. Lee, in October, 1870, and Charles Carter Lee, in April, 1871. The family has left an enduring impress upon the history of the nation. The father, eminent as a soldier in the War of Independence, was no less eminent as an orator and statesman. He pronounced the oration in Congress on the death of Washington, in which occurs the oft-quoted sentence, "First in war, first in peace, and first in the hearts of his countrymen." His letters to the son who has just died, while the latter was a student at Yale college, are models of epistolary literature. Of his children, Robert E. Lee occupies the most prominent place in the annals of the time, but both Smith and Charles Carter Lee were men of mark, and were profoundly respected in their native State.
