

BOILED GRAPE JUICE.—Last Saturday, Mr. James Smyth, who resides a few miles from this city, described to us a simple process adopted successfully by him in making a light quality of sweet, non-intoxicating wine. The juice is pressed from the fruit in the ordinary way, and then placed in a huge pot or tank, carefully boiled and the impurities skimmed off as they rise to the surface. After the juice, thus treated, becomes cool, it is placed in bottles or barrels as may be desired, and then stowed away for use. He has tried this process during the last two years, and he finds that there is no trouble whatever in keeping the wine thus made. So well pleased is he with the process that he proposes to make all his hereafter in the same manner. By the boiling process, it does not become necessary to rack off the wine, as it is perfectly clear and free from impurities as soon as the operation is completed. The wine thus made, he says, is wholly free from intoxicating qualities, and is a beverage to the use of which on the table the most rigid temperance advocate could not reasonably object.—Stockton Independent.

HENRY WARD BEECHER'S salary as pastor of Plymouth Church is \$25,000 a year, and probably his little perquisites for marriages and christenings amount to several thousand a year more. Several months ago it was estimated that from his church, his lectures and his literary work, he had an annual income exceeding \$50,000; and yet he had to mortgage his homestead to raise that little \$5,000 check for Tilton. The Law of Newspapers.

- 1. Subscribers who do not give express notice to the contrary are considered as wishing to continue their subscriptions.
2. If any subscribers order the discontinuance of their newspapers, the publisher may continue to send them until all arrears are paid.
3. If subscribers neglect or refuse to take their newspapers from the office to which they are directed, the law holds them responsible until they have settled the bills, and ordered them discontinued.
4. If subscribers remove to other places without informing the publisher, and the newspapers are sent to the former direction, they are held responsible.
5. The courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers from the office, or removing and leaving them uncollected, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.
6. The postmaster who neglects to give the legal notice of the neglect of a person to take from the office the newspapers addressed to him, is liable to the publisher for the subscription price.

AIKEN, ATTORNEY-AT-LAW, and Commander of the Grand Army of the Republic in California and Nevada, will give prompt attention to the collection of Additional Travel Pay, now due California and Nevada Volunteers discharged 300 miles from home. Soldiers can depend on fair dealing. Information given free of charge. When writing enclose stamp for reply and state company and regiment and whether you have a discharge. Congress has extended the time for filing claims for additional Bounty under Act of July 28, 1866, to January, 1875, so all such claims must be made before that time. Original Bounty of \$100 has been allowed all volunteers who enlisted before July 22, 1861, for three years, if not paid the same when discharged. Land Warrants can be obtained for services rendered before 1855, but not for services in the late war. Pensions for late war and 1812 obtained and increased when allowed for less than disability warrants, but no pensions are allowed to Mexican and Florida war soldiers. State of Texas has granted Pensions to surviving veterans of Texas Revolution. New Orleans and Mobile River Money is now due and being paid. W. H.
