The following is the bill organizing the county of Lake, passed by the late Legislature:

ORGANIZATION OF LAKE COUNTY.

AN ACT To create the county of Lake and fix the salaries of County Judge and Treasurer. Be it enacted by the Legislative As-

sembly of the State of Oregon: SECTION 1. That all that portion of the State of Oregon embraced within the following boundary lines be, and the same is hereby, created and organized into a separate county by the name of Lake, to-wit : Beginning on the forty-second parallel of north latitude at a point where said parallel is intersected by the east boundary of township No. 23, east of the Willamette Meridian, thence due north on said township line to the south boundary line of township No. 22 south of the Oregon base line, thence due west on said township line to the east boundary line of Lane county, thence southerly along said boundary line and the east boundary line of Douglas county to the southeast corner of said Douglas county, thence to, and south on the east boundary of township No. 4 farmer. Good Cows.-The difference between a good cow and a poor one is not generally appreciated. Often than otherwise, the price at which cows are bought and sold, is made to accord with the amount of milk they will give. But this is not a sound way of estimating their value. Beef cattle may be estimated by the pounds of beef they will make. A bullock that will make 500 pounds of beef may be worth half as much as one that will make 1,000 pounds, but a cow that produces only 100 pounds of butter a year is not worth half as much as one that will make 200 pounds in the same time. As it will take the former cow two years to make as much butter as the latter does in one, she will cost her owner a year's keeping more than the other will to get the same amount.
