In some of the Eastern States the number of subordinate effect.

Granges had become so large as to render the membership of the State Grange too numerous and their meetings too unwieldy. Hence a proviscisco ion is introduced limiting the membership of the State Grange, when it shall become necessary in the judgment of such Grange. The State Grange is authorized to provide for the election of a certain proportion of those entitled to membership from each county, and the members so chosen shall constitute the State Grange. As the number of subordinate Granges in California is now 250, and each Grange is entitled to two members in the State Grange-the Master and his wife (if a Matron)-the State Grange would be composed of 500 members, a number entirely too large for a business body. It also authorizes each State Grange to establish District or County Granges in each county, composed of Masters, Past Masters and their wives (if Matrons,) the State Grange to issue dispensations for such District and County Granges.
