PETITION.—The following is a copy of a petition which is being extensively circulated through Benton and Linn counties:

To the Hon. Senators and Representatives of the Oregon Legislature at its Ninth Biennial session: Your petitioners would very respectfully represent that the means of transportation and travel in Oregon are under the control of three corporations, to-wit: The O. and C. Railroad Co., the W. T. & L. Co., and the O. S. N. Co., that said corporations have formed a combination of interest and power together in unison, by which they have increased the rates of freight and fares, and charge for the same such a price as greatly injures the best interests of the people of the State of Oregon; and believing that this monopoly is derogatory to the vital interests of the people, controlling as they do the portages of the Columbia river and the locks of the Willamette river, which last named were built at a heavy expense to the people of the State, and believing there is a disposition on the part of said corporations, and a concerted effort and plan to compel the people to pay more than a fair and reasonable price for transportation; and believing that no relief can be obtained without legislation, and believing further that the people ought and in justice have a right to demand such relief as will insure to the greatest number the greatest good, and give to every citizen a just equivalent for his labor, and not be made to pay more than a reasonable and fair price for transportation, thereby impoverishing him; we therefore very respectfully ask of your honorable body that the legislature enact a law at its next session regulating fares and freights over all the railways in this State; and your petitioners as in duty bound will ever pray.

GERMAN WIVES.—The ordinary art forms a part of the education of women in Germany. The well-to-do tradesman, like the mechanic, takes pride in seeing his daughters good housekeepers. To effect this object the girls, on leaving school, which they do when they are about eighteen years of age, go through the ceremony of conformation, and then are placed by their parents, with a country gentleman, or in a large family where they remain one or two years, filling what may also be called the posts of servants, or doing work. They differ from a servant, however, in this—they receive no wages; on the contrary, their parents often pay for the care taken of them as well as their clothing. This is the first step in their education as housekeepers. They next pass, on the same conditions, into the kitchen of a rich private family, or into a hotel of good repute. Here they have control of the expenditures, of servants employed in it, and assist personally in the cooking, but always addressed as Miss, and treated by the family with deference and consideration.

Many daughters of rich families received similar training; with this difference, however, that they receive it in a princely mansion, or a royal residence. There is a reigning queen in Germany at the present time who was trained in this way. Consequently, the women in Germany are perfect models of economy.

WEIGHT OF PIGS FOR MARKET.—It was only a few years that swine breeders were vying with each other for the greatest weight of carcass; but this is now all changed. Hogs that will weigh 500 pounds are sold at a less price per pound than those of 250 to 300 pounds. The market in England has long favored light weights. London it chiefly supplied with pigs of less than 200 pounds weight. And this tendency of the market to pigs, well fattened, but of small weight, is just what the farmer should encourage, for it is exactly in the line of his interest. It costs more to make the second hundred pounds of a pig than the first, and still more to make the third hundred pounds, and so every pound added becomes more expensive.—Wallace's Monthly.
