

THE LITTLE GRAVE.

SMUGGLER.—Smuggler is not a disreputable defrauder of the public revenue but a distinguished descendant of the equine Adam. In fact he is at the present writing the most valuable representative of his species in the world. He belongs to Col. Russell, of Boston, and has just achieved greatness by trotting a mile in a shorter space of time than any other stallion in the world. It will be interesting to know that Smuggler is a mahogany bay, 15 hands 3 inches high, and strongly made. He was bred by Mr. J. M. Morgan, near Columbus, Ohio, and was sired by Blanco, son of Iron's Cadmus, out of a blind paining mare, said to have been a daughter of Tuck-rhoe. Cadmus was descended from American Eclipse, who was of Messenger blood. The sire of Smuggler was by the sire of Pocahontas, the fast paining mare. From this it will be seen that Smuggler was of right royal blood.

Smuggler at first showed a disposition to pace, but, this being corrected, he soon exhibited his extraordinary power as a trotter. In 1873 he trotted a mile in 2:19, and shortly afterwards his then owner, Mr. Morgan, sold him to Col. Russell for the alleged price of \$40,000. Col. Russell entered him for the \$10,000 purse at Buffalo, in August, 1874, in which he was beaten and distanced in the fourth heat, but not until he had trotted the fastest second heat ever made by a stallion. He was again beaten, one week after, at Utica. At Springfield, Aug. 18th, he won the \$4,000 purse in 2:26. At the same meeting he was distanced on the second heat by Kansas Chief in the slow time of 2:29. At Mystic Park, Sept. 2d, he was beaten by Lucille Goldust in 2:25, 2:22, 2:22, 2:23, winning the third heat. On the 15th of the same month, however, he won the \$10,000 stallion purse for the championship of America, beating Phil Sheridan, H. W. Gomet, Mambrino Gift and Vermont Abdallah in 2:23, 2:23, 2:20—the last heat equaling the time made by Mambrino Gift at Rochester, the month previous, which was the fastest on record for a third heat by stallions. On July 10th, as we have stated, Smuggler eclipsed all his former efforts. Since then, Col. Russell has been offered and refused \$100,000 for his great horse.

POSTAL LAW CHANGES.—The following changes have been made in the postal law by Congress and are now in force: Sec. 15. That transient newspapers and magazines, regular publications, designed primarily for advertising purposes, or for free circulation at nominal rates, and all printed matter of the third class, except unsealed circulars, shall be admitted to and be transmitted in the mails at the rate of one cent for every two ounces or fractional part thereof, and one cent for each two additional ounces or fractional part thereof, and the sender of any article of the third class of mail matter may write his or her name or address thereon, or on the outside thereof, with the word "from" above or preceding the same, or may write briefly or print on any package the number and names of the articles inclosed. Publishers of newspapers and periodicals may print on the wrappers of newspapers or magazines sent from the office of publication to regular subscribers, the time to which subscription has been paid, and addresses upon postal cards and unsealed circulars may be either written, printed or affixed thereto at the option of the sender. Sec. 16. That all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed.

On unsealed circulars and all mailable matter of the third class, other than that designated in the foregoing sections, postage will be charged as heretofore—one cent for each ounce or fraction thereof.
