CINNAMON .- The principal cinnamor gardens are in the vicinity of Colombo, Ceylon. The seeds are planted in prepared soil at certain distances, and as four or five are placed in a spot, the plants usually grow in clusters like the hazel bush. They attain the height of five or six feet in six or seven yards, and a healthy bush will afford two or three shoots fit for peeling, and every second year afterwards from four to seven shoots in good soil. The cinnamon season commences in May and lasts until late in October. The bark is divided into longitudinal incisions, of which two are made in the smaller shoots, several in the larger, and is then removed in strips by means of a suitable instrument. The pieces are next collected in bundles, and allowed to remain in this state for a short time, so as to undergo a degree of fermentation, which facilitates the separation of the epidermis or sharp skin. This with the green matter beneath it is removed by placing the strip of bark upon a convex piece of wood, and scraping its external surface with a curved knife. The bark now dries tressing complaint without deriving any and contracts, assuming the shape of a quill. When sufficiently dry, the cylinders are collected into bundles weighing about thirty pounds, and bound together by split bamboo, packed in chests of about 120 pounds each.
