THE WALLA WALLA Union says: Gen. W. H. Penrose, the officer in charge of the work of re-opening the Mullan Road, wrote under date of Sept 7, that 'What is known as the Mullan Road to Walla Walla, over the Coast of Alone mountains, is now re-opened for wagons. Any load on the east part of the road can be taken over if team enough is put on. The grades are very heavy, requiring ten or twelve mules to pull a load of 4,000 pounds.'

A little five-year old daughter of Dr. Perkins Taylor, of Georgia, was taken down with a spell of intermittent. It became necessary to administer quinine, which he did, in the form of small capsules. In order to induce her to take them he told her they were 'little humming birds' eggs, and were very nice. When the quinine had taken effect, she told her father in great glee, that the little birds had hatched and were singing in her head.

The United States is to day the most prosperous country in the world. Bounteous crops, rich mines of gold and silver, productive mines of coal, iron, lead and copper, a brisk demand for our manufactures are making themselves tell and the country is filling up with money drawn from the old world in payment for our produce.

GENERAL NOTES AND NEWS. If Edison would only discover some mode of utilizing the light of other days we might do away with the big bills of gas light companies.

The yellow fever is abating in Memphis, but has appeared at Forest City, Ark. On October 14th four out of the 83 cases reported proved fatal.

The vote for Governor of California at the late election falls out as follows: Perkins, Republican, 70,000; Glenn, Democrat and I B, 40,000; White, Working-man, 45,000.

The mines at Randolph, Coconino county, are being worked again. These mines, says the Mail, have represented an important industry in that county, and may be returned to their former productiveness.

Before the war, negroes were practically exempt from yellow fever, how they are subject to it almost as much as the whites. The fact is accounted for by the giving up of their simple habits and ostentatious diet.

J. C. Cartwright has appointed his brother, Edwin Cartwright, deputy internal revenue collector for the revenue district including Eastern Oregon and Columbia, Clatsop, Tillamook and Washington counties in Western Oregon.

Martha J. Bennett, of Grass Valley, California, has brought suit against Albert Matteson, of the same place, for defamation of character. She estimates the injury done her at \$10,000 and brings suit for that amount, together with counsel fees.

A few days ago the sailors on board one of the ships in port at Astoria rebelled and assaulted the mate in a brutal manner, and broke all discipline. Capt. Flavel had the vessel put in the stream and anchored her, await the return of the captain who was in Portland.

The Ogden Dispatch, of a recent date, says: Cole & Carter, railroad tie contractors, have received the contract for 600 thousand ties, to be used in extending the Utah and Northern road, from a point near Blackfoot to Boise City; from Boise to Walla Walla, W. T., and from thence to Portland, Oregon.

According to the report of the Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of I. O. O. F. of the United States which met at Baltimore last month, there are in this country 50 Grand Lodges, 6975 subordinate Lodges; 39 Grand Encampments and 1863 subordinate Encampments. The total number of affiliating members is stated at 412,291.

A very intelligible idea of the prostration of business in England may be formed by a knowledge of the fact that the annual exports from that country have fallen in value \$345,000,000 from 1872 to 1878. The largest decrease was in exports to the United States, \$113,000,000, the next largest to Germany, \$52,000,000; then to Holland, \$32,000,000; and lastly to Egypt, \$25,000,000.
