Following are the transactions in the U. S. Land Office in Roseburg for the month of October: Three hundred and ninety-six acres sold for cash; 20 homestead entries, embracing 2,254 acres; 24 pre-emption filings; 10 final homestead proofs, embracing 1,436 acres; 8 donation certificates issued; 1 entry of timber land.

A man from Rogue River Valley arrived in town last Saturday evening with about 18,000 pounds of apples and pears, which he stored in the store at corner of Miner and Oregon streets, and has another big lot on the road. They will be kept on hand for sale and made up into cider during the winter. "Eureka Journal."

The Shoshones, says an exchange, are a queer set. As soon as snow falls they are quite willing to go to work and chop wood; but as soon as the sun shines and the indications are favorable for a spell of good weather, the noble red throws down the ax, and nothing under the sun can induce him to take it up again but another snow storm or hunger.

The largest rattlesnake ever killed in California was killed on the Greenhorn Mountain, near Linn's Valley, Kern county, by Geo. Bailey. The snake, in the battle, killed two dogs, one of which died in less than fifteen minutes, and the other in about an hour. The men desired to capture it alive; but, finding that too dangerous a proceeding, Bailey shot it with a six-shooter through the head. It lacked an inch and a half of measuring six feet in length, and was eleven inches in circumference in the largest part. The rattles are just nine inches long, and are forty-two in number.

The Emigration Commissioners of New York inform us that each immigrant last year brought to the country \$50, the total amount being \$22,600,000. They think the aggregate sum received for 1879 will be much larger, as some of the immigrants bring with them from \$1,000 to \$5,000. Here we have a contrast, says the San Francisco Call, between the two kinds of immigration—European and Mongolian. The Mongols are paupers when they arrive on our shores, and send the bulk of their earnings out of the country, instead of
