SWAMP LAND DECISION.

REORDERED BY THE BOARD OF SCHOOL LAND COMMISSIONERS FOR THE STATE OF OREGON, SALEM, NOV. 10, 1879.

In the matter of the application of John Gleim for a deed to certain lands in Lake county taken by him as a homestead, and which are claimed to have been selected by the State as swamp lands.

In this case Gleim applies for a deed under the act of October 18, 1879, entitled "an act providing for the selection, location and sale of state lands, etc. section 19 of which provides that the right of the State to swamp and overflowed lands within the state of Oregon, held under the act of congress, approved March 12, 1860, in possession or claimed by any actual settler in good faith, under the pre-emption or homestead laws of the United States, before the same was segregated and selected as swamp or overflowed lands by the authorities of the said state of Oregon under the act approved October 26, 1870, and such selection confirmed as provided by the laws of the United States, and before such lands were claimed by any lawful claimant under the swamp land law of Oregon, shall be, and the same are hereby granted, released and confirmed unto said settlers respectively occupying and claiming as aforesaid any portion of swamp or overflowed lands."

The act of 1872 did not include the words "and such selection confirmed as provided by the laws of the United States," which was added by the act of October 26, 1870, and which selection confirmed as provided by the laws of the United States, and before such lands were claimed by any lawful claimant under the swamp land law of Oregon, shall be, and the same are hereby granted, released and confirmed unto said settlers respectively occupying and claiming as aforesaid any portion of swamp or overflowed lands."

Section 20 of the same act provides that the board shall issue, in such cases, a quit claim deed (see page 49, laws 1878).
