IMPORTANT SWAMP LAND DECISION.

DENNIS CRAWLEY VS. STATE OF OREGON. We learn by private advices from Washington, D. C., dated on the 23d ult., that Carl Schurz, Secretary of the Interior, has finally disposed of the important swamp land case of Dennis Crawley vs. State of Oregon, deciding against Crawley.

The land involved in this case is situated within the lake basin of Lower Klamath Lake, and was selected by the State Land Board as "swamp and overflowed" January 10, 1872, and a list of the selections filed in the office of the U. S. Surveyor General for Oregon, and in the U. S. District Land Office, on November 14, 1873.

Crawley made his filing in the local land office, claiming the land under the pre-emption law, and alleging settlement on the 1st of September previous. On March 13, 1875, Crawley applied to the local office to make his payment on the land, and to submit his proof of residence, cultivation, and improvements, as required by the pre-emption law. The case was set for hearing on the 20th of March, at which time all the proofs were submitted. The local land office concurred in the opinion that Crawley had sufficiently complied with the requirements of the pre-emption law in respect to residence, cultivation and improvements, but the Register held that this land was not subject to disposition under the pre-emption law. In this shape the case went up to the General Land Office. On January 28, 1879, the case was decided by the Commissioner of the General Land Office in favor of Crawley. From their decision the State of Oregon appealed to the Interior Department. And now comes the decision of Secretary Schurz, reversing the decision of the Commissioner, and cancelling Crawley's pre-emption flag.

This Crawley case has always been regarded as a very important one, and which the final decision reaches us, we shall perhaps refer to this matter again.

SUCCESS INSURED. We are now more than confident of the success of the Democratic state ticket. THE REPUBLICAN NOMINEES. Are E. B. Watson, a young man who is Clerk of Jackson county; said to be a good lawyer enough to answer, but certainly not a man of note or ability, with experience to sit in the Court of last resort. To speak in all fairness, this nomination has a juvenile aspect that will ill compare with what the people expect of a Supreme Court. The next is Major W. P. Lord, also a young man for such a position, considerably deaf, conceded to be a good lawyer and fair man. The third is John B. Waldo, of this city, a young man, too, of very bashful and unassuming manner; said to have a fine legal mind, but seldom seen within a Court room. Waldo, like the others, is respected, and all are lawyers; but their own friends do not expect to see them elected. That is, many well-posted Republicans quietly doubt their election. The contrast is, that Democrats have put up three veterans in the law, who have all had experience on the bench, and are much respected as well as old and influential citizens, while Republicans have selected three clever gentlemen who are young and comparatively untried. People will not consider this question from a partisan standpoint only, so it is possible one of the Republican candidates will be elected.

An Independent View. From the Park County Riverside (Indy). The late Democratic State Convention placed in nomination for Representative in Congress, the honored name of John Whiteaker. This is a just recognition of honest, faithful service rendered our State; and shows that our people are not to be controlled by the narrow and personal interests of a few. Mr. Whiteaker has earnestly pressed upon Congress the claims of his constituents for recognition; and in nothing has he labored more assiduously than in the matter of the improvement of the Bar at the mouth of the Yaquina Bay. Never in the history of national legislation has anything fraught with greater interest to our young State been presented than is this one subject of harbor improvement, nor has aid been asked where the small sum requested would be found to such an immense and permanent benefit to the State. For this object Representative Whiteaker has labored faithfully, and the name of "Honest John" has become a household word throughout most of Oregon, especially in the central and upper portions of the Willamette Valley. With these advantages, and the further prestige which the passage of this appropriation would give him, he would be invincible, and his election assured beyond a doubt. "Honest John" is good enough for us.

LET US BE REMEMBERED.—That the Democrats lost the State of Oregon by general apathy at the Presidential election four years ago. Oregon was Democratic at that time—as it is to-day—and a little exertion would have not only carried the State, but would have secured the election of a Democratic President!

One electoral vote was all that was needed to seat Samuel J. Tilden in the Executive Chair, and by the activity of the Democrats of Oregon we would have had three representatives in the Electoral College.

Fellow Democrats! let us make no more mistakes of this kind! Don't sit around your firesides or whit-tle on goods boxes, serenely thinking that our party can win, and forget the 7th day of June next, at which time votes count.—Democrat.
