ACTS SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR. The following is a complete list of acts passed at the late session and signed by the Governor.

S. B. 20—An act supplemental to an act to incorporate the town of Marshfield, in Coos county.

S. B. 108—An act to amend an act to incorporate the town of Oakland, in Douglas county.

S. B. 113—An act to incorporate the town of Prineville, Wasco county.

S. B. 70—An act to incorporate the town of Moomouth in Polk county.

S. B. 2—An act to incorporate the town of Dayton, in Yamhill county.

S. B. 9—An act to amend an act to incorporate the city of Eugene, Oregon.

S. B. 102—An act to amend an act to incorporate the city of Roseburg, Oregon.

S. B. 104—An act to amend an act to incorporate the city of Astoria, Oregon.

S. B. 107—An act to amend an act to incorporate the city of Eugene, Oregon.

S. B. 42—An act to establish and protect the rights of married women.

Section 1 repeals all laws which impose or recognize civil disabilities upon a wife on account of her husband's death.

S. B. 118—An act to define the duties and fix the compensation of the clerk of the board of school land commissioners.

S. B. 41—An act to dispose of the unfinished branch mint building, the material and the block of ground on which the same is situated at The Dalles.

S. B. 21—Repeals sections 23 and 24, title I, chapter 45, miscellaneous laws of Oregon, as compiled by Matthew P. Deady and La Fayette Lane.

S. J. R. 1—Directs the Secretary of State to purchase 100 copies of volumes 7 and 8, and 100 copies of volume 1 of the Oregon supreme court reports.

H. J. R. 14—Concurs in the proposed amendment to the constitution providing that regular sessions of the legislative assembly shall last sixty days.

H. J. R. 3—Legalizes warrant No. 240, drawn in favor of G. E. Clark and paid before any appropriation was made therefor.
