Portland fishermen are beginning to make preparations for the celebration of St. Patrick's day. The indications are that emigration into Oregon this spring will be much more than before. Eighteen insane patients perished at Philadelphia last week, being buried to death in their cells. Two anarchists were executed at Halle, Germany, recently, for attempting the life of the Emperor. The mill companies at Salem are paying 50c per bushel for white wheat and 50c for red wheat. Vice President-elect Hendricks and party have been "taking in" the World's Fair at New York. J. Pilger of Portland, dealer in cloaks, has made an assignment. Liabilities \$35,000; assets \$21,000. Joe Drake, the Marion county murderer, has been sentenced to be hanged on Friday, March 20th. There is a possibility that an extra session of Congress may become necessary in order to pass the appropriation bills. The training school for Indians will be located at the Crocker Green station as soon as suitable buildings can be erected in the latter place. The bill extending the time for the payment of agricultural taxes, extending the railroad from taxation for twenty years has passed the legislature. Judge L.
