Improvements to the value of \$125,000 are expected to be completed in the land city, Union county, this season.

At the last cleaning up on Oregon gulch, Corral de Alamo district, thirty-one pounds of pure gold was recovered.

The Iowa State Press Association will visit Oregon Bluffs on June 9th, on a special excursion to Washington territory.

General Sheridan expects to leave Washington in a few days on an inspection tour of the military posts of the west.

An Eastern paper we learn that the office postal directory held by the Simpson in Georgia has been discontinued.

The body of C. C. Smith, who perished in the wreck of the steamer "Albatross" last December, was found a few days ago.

A town in eastern Oregon, Alkali, shipped 100,000 bushels of wheat last year, and will add another million pounds this year.

At Oakland Park (Cal.) recently C. F. Gifford, Secretary of the State Board of Agriculture, was killed by a train.

The mines of Virginia city Nevada, purchased by the State in 1876, are now being worked. The bonanza mines are now being worked out.

The state treasurer's institute will convene at Portland on July 6, 7, 8 and 9, and arrangements are being made for a feast of reason and flow of soul.
