MISCELLANEOUS. DEATH OF JEFFERSON DAVIS.

Jefferson Davis was born in Todd county, Kentucky, June 3, 1808. His father, who was a soldier of the revolution, removed to Woodville, Miss., where Jefferson was an infant. In 1824 young Davis was appointed to the United States Military Academy by President Monroe.

On his graduation in 1828 he was assigned to the First Infantry and served in the Blackhawk war. He became first lieutenant of dragoons in 1832, and resigned June 30, 1835, and having married after a romantic courtship, returned to his plantation.

He was appointed to his return from the war in 1845, and was elected United States Senator in 1845. He was re-elected for a full term in 1850. He was a member of the Missouri Compromise line to the Pacific, and was a zealous advocate of states' rights.

On his way home he made a speech in Tennessee in which he predicted there would be no war, that the Union would be preserved, and that the South would be satisfied with its lot.
