America's revolution is reported on for the time in the Hawaiian Islands, where King Kalakaua once more finds his throne tottering under him. There will doubtless be a rebellion in the islands before the agitation dies out.

Since the California phenomenon, we again make the effort to beat the record of Maui's S. A. Belmont at the 20th Street Park, Philadelphia, on September 4th, at which time he will also be at the station record of 2.12 made by the Albatross last year.

The U. S. Senate is now considering the McKinley tariff bill, and a number of changes are being made. The Republican majority propose to force a vote on it next week, and if that is done, it will probably be passed here. This is another substantial victory for the Altamont stock.

For all accounts money is scarce in many other sections besides Southern Oregon. Even in New York, the great center of finance, the market interest ran up to an almost uniform height. A panic was only averted by the government throwing itself into the breach.

The U. S. steamer *Charlton* last week showed up suddenly in Seattle Harbor, and it was learned that she had been sent to Bellingham, in the event of the British ship *Wasp* being headed that way. The rumor was probably true, and the steamer, and the *Charlton*, will, in all probability, return to San Francisco shortly.

Sixty-four men have triumphed over Harrison, Reed & Co., and action on the force bill has been postponed until next December, when Congress convenes again. The popular measure will also be voted on to see whether it passes this fall after having stood such an infamous measure. They will nevertheless be severely rebuked at the hands of their constituents who surely be Democratic.

Walter, the editor of the *Times*, was enjoying the hospitality of the people of Portland, as president of the Oregon press association, and making a tour of the country in a carriage which he had brought from the States. The crowds enroute were highly impressed upon him. It takes a long time to make the circuit of the country even in a carriage, and much greater is the enthusiasm spread, and by far the greater portion of it is thickly inhabited; so if we were to make a guess, in our opinion Portland has a population of over 90,000.

Federal judges, Deady of Oregon and Myrick of California, continue to make decisions in favor of the Chinese. No wonder the Scott law cannot be made operative and the regular of Myrick, the board of supervisors of San Francisco passed a law, known as the Bingham ordinance, which requires that city to seat central authorities. A legal contest took place in Judge Sawyer's court, and as might have been expected the Chinese won.

The leading members of the M. E. church evidently do not like Mr. L. A. Arguello, the president of the conference, after the affair of the Klamath Indian reservation, as they "resoundingly" rebuked him at the late conference, and again at the meeting of the conference in the disused York Hotel.
