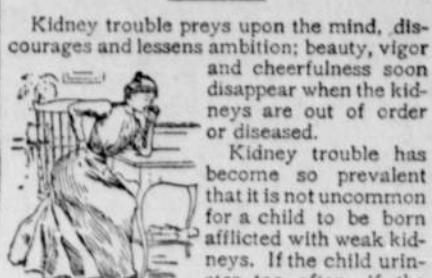

Postmaster For Seventy-two Years.

The oldest postmaster in the United States, Roswell Barsley, who is 91 years old and has handled the mail at North Lansing, Tompkins county, N. Y., for 72 consecutive years, has been invited to attend the inauguration as a guest of the department. Mr. Barsley was appointed by John Quincy Adams and has served under 19 presidents and 23 postmasters general.

Soon after he entered the cabinet the attention of Postmaster General Smith was attracted to this Methuselah of the postal service, and an examination of his record showed that in all the years he had been in office not a single complaint of the management of his office had been filed. Mr. Smith wrote him a letter congratulating him upon his long and faithful service and received one in reply in Mr. Barsley's own handwriting saying that though he was 90 years old he was still able to attend to the duties of his office.

The town of North Lansing has not grown much since 1828, when Mr. Barsley was appointed, with a salary of \$175 a year, and he still receives the same salary.

PEOPLE OF THE DAY.

After the 4th of next March William E. Chandler will retire from the United States senate, the Republicans of the New Hampshire legislature having designated Henry E. Burnham as his successor. Senator Chandler has been a conspicuous figure in the upper branch of congress since 1887, when he was elected to fill the unexpired term

of the late Austin E. Pike. He was elected in 1880 and again in 1895. Senator Chandler is 66 years of age, and the greater part of his active life has been spent in the public service, being appointed reporter of the supreme court of New Hampshire in 1859, shortly after being admitted to the bar. He was for a number of terms speaker of the New Hampshire house of representatives. Subsequently he held various federal offices, being secretary of the navy during a portion of President Arthur's administration. During the past quarter of a century there have been in public life few more virile, energetic and aggressive characters than Senator Chandler, and his retirement removes from congress a notable figure.

New York Society's Latest Favorite. Mrs. William Astor, who is recognized as the arbiter of New York's fashionable society, has appointed Mr. Harry Lehr as her private secretary, which places him on the topmost round of the social ladder in the metropolis. Mr. Lehr has been the agent of a wine establishment and found his principal customers among the aristocratic people of New York and Newport. For selling wine to society he got \$10,000 a year, but it is said that he will receive very much more as Mrs. Astor's private secretary. Mr. Lehr has shown

Plenty of Sheep.

It has been merely a question of bad or worse in the sheep trade for some time, says The National Stockman. Prices have been unsatisfactory. The reason is that there have been too many sheep. The renewing of our flocks, which began several years ago, especially the great boom in the range country, is now being felt in the market. Sheep breeders can market a liberal surplus annually now and still build up their flocks. As to the winter's markets for fat sheep and lambs, prospects are not in favor of any such prices as ruled last winter. Liberal numbers are on feed, and they are still going into the feed lots freely. An extraordinary demand is the only hope for high prices between this time and spring.
