The announcement of Botha's surrender caused just a ripple of excitement. But, although there was a semblance of a rush on the Stock Exchange to buy Kafirs, this quickly subsided when it was seen that the public was holding aloof for official confirmation.

Rumors of Gen. Botha's surrender remain unconfirmed. It is now rumored that in Botha's negotiations with Lord Kitchener he has been anxious to know what would be his retreat when the war was over.

THE WAR IN CHINA.

Sir Ernest Satow and Mr. Conger, after consulting with the missionaries, have decided to reject the Chinese proposition, made on the suggestion of M. Piebon, that they should act as representatives of the ministers of the Powers to discuss with the Chinese plenipotentiaries the missionary question and the claims of native converts.

The Russians are taking advantage of the existing situation, and are pressing Li Hung Chang hard to rush through the Manchuria convention. More than one power beside Japan and England have remonstrated with China against the negotiations that are proceeding at St. Petersburg.

It is reported that 10,000 French troops will return to France in March.

Special Commissioner Rockhill at Peking has been instructed to make it known to the foreign ministers that the President strongly disapproves any action that will tend to delay or check the present negotiations there, and especially is desirous that there shall be no unnecessary bloodshed.
