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

The present pension laws require an annual expenditure of \$145,245 230. The National Homes for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers require this year an appropriation of more than \$3,000,-000, and the State Homes for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers will receive \$950 .-000. The last session of Congress ap-propriated \$325,000 for back pay and rounty to soldiers of the civil war; \$200,000 for arrears in pay in the Spanish war, and \$27,000 for artificial limbs and appliances. This does not take into account the \$4,000,000 for annual salaries and expenses in operation of the pension bureau and the record and pension office.
