The procedure in locating quartz  
claims, as provided by the law of the  
last legislature is this: First, posting  
discovery notices, which shall give  
the general direction and approximate  
size of the claim; second, marking  
the boundaries by six posts or monu-  
ments, each at least four inches  
square and projecting three feet above  
the surface, one at each corner, and  
one at the center of each end line;  
third, discovery work; fourth, record-  
ing of notice of location (which must  
first be sworn to before some author-  
ized officer) by the county recorder.

### For the Lawson Cups.

James R. Hooper, chairman of the  
special committee of the Hull-Massa-  
chusetts Yacht club, has issued a pre-  
liminary circular containing infor-  
mation for the guidance of those who  
will enter yachts for the races for cups  
presented by Thomas W. Lawson, to be  
sailed off Boston lights on Sept. 2  
or some later day not less than one or  
more than two weeks after the last of  
the America's cup races. The condi-  
tions of the races are as follows: First,  
to all single masted sailing yachts  
measuring over 80 feet and not over 90  
feet in length on the load water line;  
second, to all yawl rigged yachts; third,  
to all schooner rigged yachts; fourth,  
to all single masted sailing yachts  
measuring not over 75 feet in length  
on the load water line; fifth, to all sin-  
gle masted sailing yachts measuring  
not over 65 feet in length on the load  
water line; sixth, to all single masted  
sailing yachts measuring not over 51  
feet sailing length under the rules of  
the New York Yacht club; seventh, to  
all schooner rigged fishing vessels, to  
be sailed for without time allowance.

### Brady Not a Turfman.

A false report has caused a great  
deal of annoyance to Billy Brady, the  
well known theatrical man and man-  
ager of Jim Jeffries. It was to the  
effect that Brady was the real owner  
of the 2-year-olds purchased from Phil  
Dwyer by Colonel F. C. McLewee and  
that he would start a formidable  
string of 2-year-olds in the eastern  
campaign. Brady, it was said, had  
dabbled considerably in Wall street  
during the winter under advice of Mc-  
Lewee and had quit \$300,000 ahead.  
Brady says relative to the rumors:  
"There is no truth in them. I have  
no intention of going into the racing  
business. I have my hands full at  
present with my own line. Any horse  
that I will buy will be merely for my  
own use and for my family. No, I  
have not bought any 2-year-olds nor  
have I been in Wall street."

### Vardon Again Defeated.

Harry Vardon met J. H. Taylor, the  
open champion, on the links at Wal-  
ton-on-Thames recently and was de-  
feated. The course consists of nine  
holes. At the end of the first round  
the players were even, but Taylor  
completed the eighteenth hole with one  
put. Vardon's putting was not in form.  
He made two extra difficult holes and  
missed several easier ones.

### St an Oriole.

Manager McGraw of the Baltimore  
Americans has signed St Seymour, the  
erratic New York pitcher. Captain  
Robinson says that for the present Sey-  
mour will be played in the outfield and  
will be used principally for his batting  
ability and fast work on the bases.

### THE WAR IN CHINA.

A dispatch to the Journal and Advertiser,  
from Peking, says: Unless something occurs,  
Field Marshal von Waldersee will return to  
Europe in June. He has received an invitation  
from the Emperor of Japan to spend some days  
there on his return journey, and will probably  
accept, in which case it is generally believed  
he will return through the United States, as at  
Gen. Chaffee's farewell dinner the Field Mar-  
shal said he would take the earliest opportu-  
nity to visit America.

The Ewo incident at Tien Tsin, May 4, when  
some German soldiers guarding a German  
bridge across the Pei Ho, at the south end of  
the British concession, fired on the British tug  
Fwo, wounding two of her crew, after the vessel  
had touched the bridge which impeded river  
traffic, is assuming a graver character. Owing  
to the unsatisfactory nature of the German  
commander's explanations, the matter has  
been referred to the British minister at Peking,  
Sir Ernest Satow, with a view to diplomatic  
action being taken.
