Empress Frederick of Germany, eldest daughter of the late Queen Victoria, and mother of Emperor William II, died Monday. She had long been afflicted with cancer.

The S. P. Co. intends moving its big ferry from the Port Costa and Benicia crossing to the Vallejo junction crossing at Mare Island, thereby making one ferry do all the business.

After praying several days for rain in Kansas the people of Wichita rang bells and blew whistles and serenaded the rain with a brass band. At night cannons were fired and an immense display of fireworks was made. No doubt the rain was highly gratified by this reception.

In the House of Commons Lord Stanley, financial secretary of the war office, said the war in South Africa from April 1st to July 31st cost £25,750,000. The actual cost in July was £1,250,000 weekly. The statement was greeted with ironical Irish cheers.

At the base of Mt. Taber, a few miles from Portland, last Saturday night, 1375 persons were initiated into the mysteries of Woodcraft. Many thousand Woodmen witnessed the scene, the like of which was perhaps never witnessed. Excursion trains were run from every portion of the state.

During the athletic contests attendant upon the quarto-centennial celebration at Colorado Springs, Aug. 3d, Candiras de Foya, a Ute Indian, broke the world's running record for 100 yards, making the distance in 9 seconds flat. The professional record was 9 3/5 seconds, and the amateur record 9 4/5 seconds.

A letter from a soldier in South Africa, dated July 6, says the Boers wrecked a train near Naboomspruit, July 4. One hundred and fifty Boers attacked the train guard, and 28 Gordon Highlanders were killed, 18 wounded and 10 captured. The conductor, engineer and fireman of the train were subsequently shot.

Two townships in the Cascade Forest Reserve will be thrown open on the 30th of September. One township is in Crook and the other in Klamath. They will be opened through the influence of the Little Deschutes Irrigation Co., which owns 13 sections of land and has taken a large irrigation ditch out of the Deschutes river, that will go directly through these two townships. The land is said to be of good quality.

A. D. Edgar, who died at Nome on June 10, went there last year and engaged in the freighting business. He was formerly a well-known stage and mail contractor in California and Oregon. As far back as 1860 he was a trusted employe of Wells-Fargo Express Co., and had hosts of friends throughout the Pacific coast. Before going to Nome he had made his home at The Dalles. He has a son and several brothers. Mr. Edgar was about 65 years of age. Death was due to chronic inflammation of the bladder.

The well-known Selby Smelting Works at Vallejo, Calif., were robbed lately of three hundred and thirty thousand dollars in gold bricks. The robbers had tunneled under the vault and then used high explosives. They made good their escape in a small tug. This is one of the greatest robberies that has ever occurred on the Pacific coast. Evidently the robbers had been at work weeks, perhaps months, running the tunnel, the dirt being dumped into the bay. These works handled a great portion of the bullion of the Pacific coast, and especially from Alaska.
