

Heater For Beds and Feet.

It is not at all pleasant to be compelled to crawl into a cold bed when retiring to rest, and yet on many a winter night it is next to impossible to warm the beds to the desired temperature unless a large amount of coal is consumed, and in houses where no furace is provided the temperature of the



MAKES THE BED COMPORTABLE. bed is so low that a serious shock may be sustained by the system. To overome the low temperature in a safe and simple manner Edwin T. Keener of Delaware, O., has designed the bed warmer pictured in the cut. The inventor provides an elongated oval heating drum for attachment to the footboard of the bed, with a funnel projecting downward from the center and an outlet at the upper side for the passage of the air and gases. In connection with this arrangement a small amp of any ordinary pattern is used, the hood which surrounds the chimney being fitted with a sustaining spring to keep the lamp in a fixed position beneath the funnel. A wick adjusting rod is also provided, which may be turned without rising, the position of the eyelet at the end of the rod indicating how far it should be turned to put out or raise the flame. The heater is claimed to be entirely safe and while heating the bed to the desired temperature has the advantage of not raising the temperature of the room to an unhealthy degree for sleeping.

Baked Corn.

If young, shave from the ear, scrapng the cob; if old, draw a sharp knife down each row and press out the pulp with the knife's back. Season with salt, pepper, a generous lump of butter (a tablespoonful to three cupfuls of pulp) and add enough cream or rich milk to nearly cover. Melt some butter, roll some soft bread crumbs in it to moisten them, then spread them over the corn. Dust with salt and pepper and bake a half hour. When done, cover the baking dish for ten minutes in the open oven to soften the browned crumbs before serving.

The Way to Wash Chintz.

When washing chintz, begin by boiling two pounds of rice in two gallous of water until soft. Pour this into the tub, and when just moderately warm out the chintz in and wash it without soap. Boil the same quantity of rice and water again. Strain off the rice and mix it with warm water, preserving the water in which it was boiled for rinsing water. Wash the chintz in the warm water and rice, then rinse in the boiling water in which the rice was boiled.


