The Sterling Mining Co., A. W. Sturgis and other big miners in this section are waiting for sufficient water to resume operations with.

Miners' liens, deeds to mines, water-right locations and other mining blanks always on hand at THE TIMES office.

The Williamsburg Mining Company of Grant's Pass has been organized with a capital of \$500,000. F. E. Fobes, T. J. McClung, Robert G. Smith, L. A. Heberle are the incorporators.

The American Mining Code, standard authority on all subjects pertaining to mining, water-rights, etc., is kept on hand at THE TIMES office.

The official records at the gold commissioner's office at Dawson, where export certificates for all gold going from the country must be obtained, show that the gold shipments from Dawson for September amounted to \$3,000,000. This brings the total for the last four months to \$21,640,000.

J. N. Hayes was in Jacksonville Wednesday. He is operating in Sardinia creek district, and has rented his placer mines to parties living in Medford. At present Mr. H. is developing some promising quartz ledges. He has a fine one five feet deep, one from which at the depth of 50 feet assays \$24.05 copper and \$23.44 gold a ton. It is located five miles north of Gold Hill.

Word has been received at Gold Hill from the Meadows district that Reed & Fletcher, while developing one of their cinnabar claims, cut through a 20-inch vein of coal. Specimens of the find, while not yet submitted to an analytical test, bear every indication of being of good quality. The vein lies at a depth of 112 feet.

A short time ago a company of mining men organized for the purposes of locating, developing and working quicksilver or cinnabar claims in southern Oregon. The Meadows district, where the company has five claims, was the first to receive their attention. Of these, and of the score of others that have since been located, the Mayfield is supposed to be the most valuable. The original 10-foot hole was the portion of a shaft sunk on what was supposed to be a crossing on a new claim. From this drifts have been run each way, exposing a 10-foot vein of cinnabar, carrying good value from wall to wall. The shaft itself is sunk in a chimney of cinnabar ore that is thought to be quite rich.
