At the beginning of the open season the birds were never more plentiful. But thousands have been killed this season, and they are comparatively scarce. The illegal hunting of these birds is also an important factor in lessening their numbers. It is a fact that some farmers kill the birds at all times of the year. So far has the fame of this splendid game bird spread that a great number of sportsmen come to Linn county every year to hunt at the beginning of the open season. Many hunters come from Washington and California, and sometimes there are hunters here from the East.

Feed For the Brood Sow.

A brood sow should be fed a variety, such as bran, roots, etc. Corn is fattening and should not be fed in large quantities. It promotes neither the growth of the sow nor the pigs. Some green vegetable food should be given in winter.

Value of Stable Blankets.

Stable blankets save oats and keep the horses' coats smooth. They are also as useful on the cows. Bran sacks may be doubled and used for this purpose.
