UNCLE SAM TO THE RESCUE

How He Went to the Relief of the West India Sufferers.

Uncle Sam has astonished the civilized world with the celerity with which he has dispatched relief to the starving survivors of the Martinique disaster. Never has his purse strings been loosened so readily as in this instance.

No sooner was it definitely known that help was needed by the West Indians than Rear Admiral Barker, commandant of the Brooklyn navy yard, was ordered to get the cruiser Dixie ready to proceed at once to Fort de France. Admiral Barker immediately got to work, and in a marvelously short time the cruiser was ready for sea. On the sixth day after Mont Pelee had blotted out St. Pierre the United States cruiser Dixie sailed from New York harbor loaded to the gunwales with food, medicine and clothes for the sufferers.

But this was merely a beginning. In the meantime congress, at the request of the president, had appropriated \$500,000 to help the unfortunates, a national relief committee had been ap-



pointed and thousands of dollars began rolling in for the same purpose of mercy from all over the land.

The promptness and munificence of the American people in relieving the distress of the West Indies have fairly taken the breath away from France and excited favorable comment in the British house of commons. The French papers referred feelingly to the sympathy manifested by congress and the American people, saying that such generosity tends to draw together the ties already uniting the two republics.

Admiral Barker, through whose energetic efforts the Dixie was made ready, is a native of Massachusetts and was graduated from the Naval academy in 1861. During the Spanish war he commanded the Newark and at the close of hostilities succeeded Captain Clark as commander of the Oregon. The operations of the naval personnel bill made him a rear admiral. He is very valiant and is interested in the navy branch of the Y. M. C. A.

Lightning and the Eyes.

One night during a thunderstorm of rare severity, in which brilliant flashes, single, double, triple or quadruple, followed one another at intervals often of not more than a few seconds of time, I was surprised to see with great vividness on a suddenly illuminated sky two nearly vertical lines of darkness, each of the ordinary jagged appearance of a bright flash of lightning. I remembered to have seen two real flashes of just the same shapes and relative positions and concluded that the black flashes were due to their residual influence on the retina. I turned my eyes quickly from the dark sky outside to an illuminated wall inside the house, and I again saw the same double dark flash, which verified my conclusion in an interesting manner. The fatigued part of the eye failed to perceive the sudden brightness of the sky in the one case and of the wall in the other.—Lord Kelvin in Electrician.
