## CURRENT COMMENT.

JOHN WAMAMAKER'S SON, Rodney, has taken out a policy for an additional \$1,000,000 on his life. He carries \$2,000,000 insurance now, \$500,000 more than his father, but not as much as King Edward of England.

AN OFFICIAL of the Interior Department says that gigantic swindles against the Government have been uncovered in Oregon, and says that indictments will probably be secured against a number of former leaders of land offices in this state. The report of the experts who have been making the investigation on behalf of the Interior Department has not been made public; but it is generally understood to contain sensational revelations.

COL. FRANK V. DRAKE has resigned as superintendent of the Oregon Information Bureau, which is maintained at Portland as a place where all newcomers can go to secure information about any part of Oregon. Since Col. Drake has made the report on his hand, it will not be difficult for his successor to take up the work where he left off and continue to inform visitors of the resources of the state, though the position is not an easy one to fill, for to properly illustrate Oregon's varied resources is no small task.

EX-GOVERNOR LORD, U. S. minister to Argentina, will arrive in Oregon this week. He says that he was advised by his physician to take a vacation, as he has run very hard, spending nearly four consecutive years in Buenos Ayres. Already he is much benefited by the change of climate. He will spend several weeks in Oregon before returning to his station. Mr. Lord did not know until advised by the Oregonian correspondent that the Oregon delegation had recommended Charles H. Carey to succeed him. He had nothing to say either as to their action or his future intentions.

EASTERN DEMOCRATS hope that the next national campaign may be fought largely on the tariff issue. They realize that the Republican Congress at the coming session will not enact legislation amending the Dingley schedule; therefore there will be every opportunity for making the fight on the tariff. It is also to be noted that Eastern Democrats are becoming more conservative on the tariff. Many who a few years ago were rampant free traders and advocated the complete overthrow of the Republican tariff are now advocating only a modification of that tariff, particularly on trust-made articles.

WISCONSIN has lost her supremacy as queen of the pine forests. The formal announcement has been made that one of the largest timber operators in the northern woods, together with the last of the great lumbermen have preceded them, some to the Pacific Coast, with its wealth of redwood, fir and pine, others to the vast virgin forests of the South. Within the last two years it is estimated that \$20,000,000 capital has left Wisconsin forests for the West or South. No less than a dozen great lumbering companies have abandoned Wisconsin for the fresher forests.

THE UNITED STATES will protest against the practical cession of Manchuria to Russia. This country will act independently of Great Britain and Japan, though in harmony with them. Russian officials profess to be surprised at the protests of America, and try to explain away the demand made on China. Germany will not interfere, considering Manchuria under her sphere of influence. Russia and France are thoroughly agreed on a policy in China, and it is predicted that France will take the next step in partition. A diplomat at Washington explains that Russia is in the habit of asking for the maximum and afterwards making concessions, and that she will doubtless yield large privileges to American commerce.

Removal of Alkali.

In experiments on the Honda bottom lands near Rosewell, N. M., for the removal of alkali, nearly all of the "white" type, it was found that where the water table was within six inches or less of the surface the amount of alkali was low. The maximum effect of capillarity in Honda meadows soil was found where the water table was about two feet below the surface of the ground, as was shown by the maximum accumulation of alkali. Drains less than three feet deep were not effective. Thin floodings applied to the surface of the land covered surface removed about one-seventh of the total alkali from the first two feet of soil and carried a large amount of that formerly in the first foot down to the second. Seepage water should be cut off by deep drains placed on the side of the land from which it comes. Combined open and the drains cost from \$20 to \$30 per acre.
