### THE COPPER MINES OF THE SISKIYOU

The Blue Lead, Recently Bonded by Spokane Parties, Promises to Revolutionize Mining in this Section.

"Unless the bottom drops out of the mine the Blue Ledge is one of the greatest properties in the country," said Patrick Clark yesterday. Mr. Clark and his partner, B. C. Kingsbury, have returned to Spokane from the copper wonder in Siskiyou county, Calif., five miles south of the Oregon line, which they have bonded through Dr. J. F. Reddy, for a sum said to be \$250,000.

"So far as it is developed it has the most ore in sight for a prospect at the same stage that I ever saw in my life. A drift has been run for 125 feet from the point where the ore body was found, and for the whole distance the tunnel is in clean chalcopryite ore, with not a single bit of waste as large as a pea to be found for the whole distance. The cleanness of the ore is one of its most extraordinary characteristics. In appearance it much resembles the War Eagle and the Leo Rock, such as was shipped out of Rossland in the early days of the camp.

MARVELOUSLY CLEAN ORE. "Crosscuts have shown that the ore body is 20 feet wide, and on the foot wall side there is a horse seven or eight feet wide, beyond which there is another high-grade ore shoot from three to four feet wide, which runs from 12 to 15 per cent. in copper. That would ordinarily be considered a fine showing in itself, but it is entirely outclassed by the main showing in the tunnel. The big ore body, 20 feet wide, and so far as proven, 125 feet long, averages from 4 to 5 per cent. copper, and from \$1 to \$5 in gold. Estimating copper at 12 cents a pound, which is considerably below its real value, the ore is easily worth \$15 a ton as it lies in the mine.

"The showing underground, however, is not the only surprising thing about the property. The ledge has been staked for the length of 16 claims, and has traces strong and vigorous over the mountain for four miles. The outcrop is from 100 to 200 feet wide, and in places the vein is eroded below the level of the walls, which are of schist. The ledge stands up firm and strong at an angle of about 60 degrees from the horizontal.

"The lay of the country is admirably adapted to economic mining. Wood and water are there in abundance, and the ground is so steep that it is possible to reach a depth of 2,000 feet by drilling a tunnel of moderate length. With long tunnels it is possible to get a depth of perhaps 3,000 feet.

PUSHING WORK WITH 20 MEN. "We have until December next to make our first payment under our bond, and we are pushing work with a crew of about 20 men. They have started a tunnel lower down the hill. I have arranged with the Boy's Diamond Drill Company of Spokane to do from 2,000 to 3,000 feet of diamond drilling, and the drillers will get their outfits on the ground about the first of the month.

"It is a \$2,000,000 proposition to purchase the property, carry on development and put it to a productive stage, for it will be necessary to build a rail and 40 miles in length to carry out the ore to connect with the S. P. through Jacksonville, Oregon, and will be necessary to erect a smelter to treat the output of the mine. The ore is comparatively low grade, and must be handled in the most economical manner possible. If the property continues to show up under development as it is showing now, it will easily supply ore for a 500-ton smelter. But all of these calculations are dependent upon the chance that the ore holds out at depth. Frankly, I believe that it will, but its permanence is the thing that we are now trying to prove."

### Another Forest Reserve.

The Interior Department has decided upon another forest reserve for Oregon, this time in southern Lake county, in the Warner mountain country. By direction of Secretary Hitchcock the vacant public lands in a tract of over 900,000 acres in Lake county, and 44 townships adjoining. In northern California, have been temporarily withdrawn from settlement, with a view to their examination to determine the advisability of creating a forest reserve about the town of Lakeview. The Oregon lands with drawn are: Townships 34 to 41 inclusive, ranges 16, 17 and 18; townships 37, 38 and 41, range 19; townships 36 and 37, range 20; townships 36 to 41 inclusive, ranges 21 and 22, all south and east. The township in which Lakeview is located, and the townships in immediately north, south and west, are not included in the withdrawal.

### STATE ELECTIONS THIS YEAR.

Though the chief interest in politics at present centers in the presidential election next year, a diversion will be found this fall in several state elections. These elections will not be without effect on the campaigns of next year, and for this reason will be watched with much interest by the politicians of the country.

The state that will attract the greatest interest is Ohio. Hanna will be a candidate for re-election to the United States senate and will seek to control the party machinery and dictate the choice of the Republican nominee for governor. Ohio is a great political battleground and Tom Johnson, Golden Rule Jones, John R. Mean and Democratic affiliations will not be asleep.

Another important state is Iowa. The "Iowa Idea" will be tried out in the political courts of the state, and though it may have no result on the next platform, if Governor Cummins is successful in his state much encouragement may be given to the revisionists, and incidentally to the Democrats.

Our states holding elections, the results of which will be watched for anxiously, are Maryland, Kentucky, Massachusetts and Rhode Island. Owing to a favorable election law the Democrats will carry Kentucky. In Maryland, though the Republicans have won in the last two presidential elections, they have four of the six members in Congress. The present governor is a Democrat and Gorman is again on vantage ground. The Democrats have the present governor of Rhode Island, but political factional fights, and will seek to make good their claims of strength in New England. Their only hope in Massachusetts is to cut down the Republican majority.

The warmest fight between Republicans and Democrats during the fall will be in Ohio, if Johnson is nominated for governor; but because of the nearness in time to the next presidential election results will be closely watched everywhere.

### Canned Jack Rabbits.

Several enterprising citizens intend to can not less than a million jack rabbits this summer, which are now overrunning Eastern Oregon. How to rid the state of the jacks has been an unsolved problem for years. Investigation has shown that wild rabbits are more gamey in flavor and sell better for use in dining cars, swell restaurants, hotels and clubs than domesticated Belgian hares. A cannery is accordingly to be built at Echo, situated below Pendleton. The privilege has been secured under contracts signed with scores of landholders to hunt rabbits on their property. The land now covered by contracts supports at least a million rabbits. In a few weeks the young rabbits will be in good form and active work will begin. A rabbit dresses two and a half pounds, giving two and a half million pounds available on the lands secured. The market price of a rabbit is 10 cents per pound. A cold storage plant will be erected in connection with the cannery.
