THE prosecution of an interesting case has just been undertaken by the State Department, which involves a claim of \$5,000,000 against Great Britain for damage accruing from the unwarranted and illegal action of President Kruger of the Boer Republic. It appears that one Charles Brown, an American mining engineer, acquired certain mining lands in the Transvaal by squatter proceedings. His claim was adjudicated by the Boer courts and pronounced valid, but President Kruger ordered the decision of the courts reversed, and on the refusal of the chief justice to comply with his instructions Kruger deposed him without legal proceedings and vacated the title. Brown appealed to the State Department and the case was taken up, but was suspended by the Boer war. 




