NEAR TRINITY CENTER. Redding, Dec. 28.—Francis Sevedge was shot through the heart on the public road, two miles north of Trinity Center, in Trinity county, Saturday afternoon, and A. Price, a miner, is in the county jail at Weaverville, fifty-five miles from the scene,

charged with the murder. Five men were involved in the shooting. Sevedge and James Usher, both of Trinity Center, were driving to Carrville when they met three strangers in that section walking toward Trinity Center. The five men engaged in an altercation, the origin of which cannot be learned here, as the telegraph line is down. Shots were exchanged, and a bullet from a gun held by Price pierced Sevedge's heart.

Late Sunday evening word was re ceived from Weaverville that a pros pector named A. Price had been arrested at Trinity Center charged with having killed Sevedge, and was safely lodged in the county jail at Weaverville, which is fifty-seven miles from Trinity Center.
