The following is a list of jurors drawn to serve at the regular March term of the Circuit Court for Jackson County:

SENATOR HANSBROUGH, chairman of the public lands committee, introduced a bill February 20th, amending the lieud law in a way to rob it of its objectionable features. It provides that wherever lands covered by patents or unperfected claims are included in a forest reserve, hereafter created, the owner of such lands may, upon relinquishing title to the Government, have his lands and improvements appraised and be paid by the Secretary of the Interior the full appraised value of the same; but he shall not have the right to select other lands in lieu of that relinquished.
