THE recent movement in Philadelphia in the interests of school teachers and their pay brought the meager wages which the instructors of the youths receive; but more surprising things are coming to light from the investigation of the New England Educational Association and other bodies. The average yearly salary of the 48,-000 public school teachers of the United States is \$296. The average salary of the men is less than \$332, and of the women less than \$270. We are on the eve of a great movement of the American public schools. Students of our social and government problems, "socialogists" and plain Americans, are recognizing the utility of the Ameri can school as the mighty agency which turns human raw material into American citizens, and earnest men are considering methods of making the school even more effective than it is. One prominent first thing to be done is to improve the teacher; improve his or her physique, equipment, character. And yet it is not likely that any method of doing this will be hit upon except by offering suitable inducements to ambitious young men and women to adopt teaching as life work, by paying them respectable salaries.
