CONGRESS adjourned for the term April 28th, which is one of the earliest adjournments that has taken place in many years.

SECRETARY FITZCOCK has ordered Supervisor Holland and Inspector Nesler to proceed to the Chemawa Indian Training School in Oregon and make a thorough investigation of charges of mismanagement that have been made against Superintendent Potter.

THE timber and stone act will be repealed for another year at least, so that people who desire to get a timber claim will have a fair opportunity. The commission appointed by the President recommended the repeal of this law, and the Senate acted upon that recommendation and passed the bill to repeal.
