Regulations For Fires.

Every summer and autumn large areas of public and private forests are devastated by fire.

The law provides a maximum fine of \$500, or imprisonment for two years, or both, if the fire is set maliciously, and a fine of \$1000, or imprisonment for one year, if the fire is due to carelessness.

Dredging in Oregon.

There are only a very few dredgers in Oregon—one on the Snake river, near Ontario, operated by the Moraine Mining Co., which has a capacity of 2000 cubic yards of gravel, which carry from 17 to 35 cents a yard; another on John Day river, four miles below the town of John Day, worked by the Empire Dredging Co. of Portland, the gravel of which is said to go 30 cents a yard.
