SHERIFF'S SALE.

Salaries May Be Attached. The California supreme court's decision that the salaries of nearly all state and county officers may be attached if of special interest to state and county officers, as well as business men throughout that state. The result of the decision is to place holders of county and minor state offices on a level with other people in the matter of responsibility for debt. Constitutional state officers are yet excepted, according to the supreme court's ruling, but deputies and employees of the state generally and all county officers may be held to account by those who trust them for goods. Hitherto the rule has prevailed that tradesmen who trusted a county officer or a deputy state officer had no legal redress if his debtor should decide to postpone payment of the account. In some instances county officers took advantage of a like exemption. Now the obligation may be enforced in a manner that is prescribed by the last legislature, and in fact is simpler than the usual method of garnishment.
