


Timber Values in Oregon.

Standing on the bridges that span he Mississippi at Minneapolis, Minn, one can see thousand of saw logs in that river. Minneapolis is a great! umber city, but that industry is now A HORTICULTURAL EXPERT. wounded more than 500 and scattered nearly at an end. To a man from Oregon it is a genuine curiosity to spend a day among the booms and mills in that city. Logs that measure logs that measure eighteen inches in diameter, but only a few. The writer spent several days among the booms, and did not see a log to exceed eighteen inches in diameter. The smaller logs looked to an Oregonian like Oregon hops poles.

The mill men admitted generally that this was a cleanup and with two or three exceptions the lumber interests would move this fall, as all timber in the porth was a thing of the past. In speaking of the timber interests of the Pacific coast he predicted in a few years the price of standing timber here would climb to a phenomenal value and advised all who could to take a timber claim and hold it.
