JOCKEY CLUB RACES!

THE first meeting of the Jackson County Jockey Club will be held at the Courthouse, on Thursday, August 2d, 1860, and will continue three days. The following is the programme of Races:

1st Day—Jockey Club Purse of \$300.—Single dash of a mile. Free for all horses. Entrance ten per cent.

A Purse of \$75.—Single dash of a mile. Free for all half-bred, Spanish or Indian Horses. Entrance 25, to be added to the Purse. Catch weights.

2d Day—Proprietors Purse of \$300.—Single dash of a mile. Free for all Oregon and California raised Horses. Entrance ten per cent.

A Purse of \$50 for Roadsters.— Mile heats; to go as they please. Entrance \$10, to be added to the Purse.

3d Day—Citizens Purse of \$400. Mile heats, best three in five. Free for all Horses. Entrance ten per cent.

A Purse of \$100.—Single dash of a mile. Free for all Saddle Horses, subject to decision of the Judges. Entrance \$25, to be added to the Purse.

N. B.—For the chief Purse given on each day, not less than three must enter; two must start to make a race.

The rules of the Metairie Jockey Club of Louisiana, will govern the racing, except in weights, which are allotted as follows: For aged Horses, 114 lbs.; for 6 year olds, 107 lbs.; for 5 year olds, 95 lbs.; for 4 year olds, 85 lbs.; for 3 year olds, 75 lbs.; for 2 year olds, leather weights.
