CIRCUIT COURT .- The week has been almost exclusively devoted to criminal business, and one or two important cases are yet to be tried. The trial of Hartwig, for killing Wm. Kohne, was concluded on Thursday morning. The jury, after a short absence from the Court room, returned a verdict of not guilty. Quite an array of counsel appeared in this case. The argument for the defense made by J. H. Reed, Esq., is spoken of as the ablest and most impressive ever heard in this county. We much regret missing the opportunity to hear it. The case of John Boyd (Kanaka), for assault with intent to murder Samuel Lemons (colored), resulted in a verdict of guilty of assault. Charles Rivas, for larceny, plead guilty.

RICH QUARTE DISCOVERY.- Last week another discovery of a gold quartz lead was made on the right fork of Jackson creek. The fortunate finders of the lode are John Woods and Joseph Holmes, both of whom have taken full claims. The vein has been industriously prospected, and each day's work upon it more satisfactorily proves the extent and richness of the rock. We have specimens taken from each claim, and they contain gold clearly perceptible over the whole surface. From a piece broken off from one of these specimens, 314 ounces, Mr. Woods obtained 87 25 of gold. and the rock is no more than average with all yet taken out, he assures us. It is certainly Tin, Sheet Iron & Copper Ware,

Mone Quantz.-Pretty soon this county will become us distinguished for the vast quantity of gold-bearing quartz, as it has for the richness of its most famous quartz lode, or for the rare beauty of its natural scenery. Every week new discoveries in mineral wealth are made. The lode is yet but indifferently prospected, but enough is known to warrant the belief that it will prove one of the richest yet discovered.
