The Mines. More cheering news comes in from the various diggings in this section, and there is reason to believe that the season's gold product will favorably compare with that of previous years...

On Rogue river, near Table Rock, the few miners engaged are doing well. Water is rather scanty at present, but by the construction of a small ditch a partial supply is obtained...

The Willow Springs diggings continue to pay from good to high wages wherever water is had. We are assured by one of the owners of a claim there that it has paid twelve dollars per day to the land every day it has been worked.

The Jackson Creek claims yield good wages steadily, and in the creek now are idle. The upper hill claims are not sufficiently supplied with water to give constant employment to their owners...

Rich Gulch, Poor Man's Creek, and other diggings in the vicinity pay well as usual.

The Applegate mines yield regularly the same average which have been obtained from them since almost the date of their discovery. Water is always plentiful. New prospects are weekly made on the upper waters and tributaries...

From near Perkins' on Rogue River, we have reports of quite an area of five dollars per day diggings, which are steadily worked. The Williamsburg miners are now supplied with water from the ditch, and all the claims are daily worked to advantage.

At Sterling and Bunkum the miners are generally employed, and receive good remuneration for their toil. Water is still scanty at Sterling, but this is not so much felt at Bunkum, where Gallagher's ditch affords a steady and nearly adequate supply throughout the year.

We have no reports from Gashburg, Crawley's, Sam's, Nor Foot's Creek diggings.
